As I reasoned that I had given it a good fight, you came and held me. You let me sob into your lap. You rubbed my tired shoulders and you provided healing. **PRISON** I know I deserved my sentence, but the bars around me never went away. You came even when your schedule was packed. You saw past my orange jumper, my embarrassment and shame. Your eves viewed me with the dignity I once had.

Are you ready to lay down your life for heaven's cause? Join the movement as we follow Christ's method of reaching the cities, and by His example, become windows of hope to those in need.





This goal doesn't change at camp meeting. Our leaders spend months prayerfully planning the programs, asking our Father which stories and activities will best reach each child. The staff builds personal relationships with the children, praying that through their feeble humanness Christ will be revealed. We ask that you join us in this mission. Pray for the children's meetings or stop by before each meeting and pray with the staff.

EVERY CHILD FROM BIRTH TO TWELVE YEARS OLD MUST BE REGISTERED

Registration not only makes it possible for your child to attend programming designed specifically for their age, but also helps security. If something were to happen to your child, security can find you through their wristband number and the information provided on the registration card.

LOCATION AND TIMES

The Children's Registration Booth is located north of the Main Auditorium in front of the Beginner's Tent. An additional Registration Booth will be set up in front of the Spanish Tent on **Sabbaths only**. Weekdays: 8:00 am–11:30 am 1:30 pm–4:30 pm 6:00 pm–7:30 pm Sabbath: 8:00 am–1:15 pm 2:30 pm–5:30 pm 6:00 pm–7:30 pm

STEPS TO REGISTER

- All children from birth to 12-years-old must be registered.
- A registration card, photo release, and medical form must be filled out completely.
- A colored wristband will be placed on child and parent.
- Parent will also be given corresponding two additional numbers to be shown at the division tent when picking up their Kindergarten or Primary child.

RULES FOR SAFETY

- Children must wear wristbands at all times.
- If parents have lost their pickup number, they must show their **approved photo** identification at registration to get a new number before picking up their child.
- Only a parent or guardian may pick up children.

Age Specific Program

Each division leader spends months prayerfully preparing a program designed specifically for your child. This makes the program more impactful for the child. It also makes it easier for staff to relate to the hundreds of children that come to each division. Please respect the process and truthfully give your child's age.

BEGINNERS Birth-3 yrs. Yellow Wristband KINDERGARTEN 4 yrs.-6 yrs. Red Wristband 7 yrs.-9 yrs. Green Wristband JUNIORS* 10 yrs.-12 yrs. Blue Wristband *Juniors may leave without parent pickup.

Forgotten Angels

Forgotten Angels is exactly that. Due to the hustle and bustle of camp meeting, some children aren't picked up until very late. This only causes distress for the child and for the staff (who need a break before preparing your child's next meeting). **Fifteen minutes** after each child's program ends, all children not picked up, will be taken to the **"Forgotten Angels Station"** located at the Children's Registration Booth after morning and afternoon programs or in the Primary Tent after the evening program. If after 30 minutes, the child is still not picked up, Security will be notified.

Lost or Broken Wristbands

All wristband replacements happen at the Children's Registration Booth. If a wristband must be replaced for any reason, the registration team will replace the first one free. For any replaced after the first free band, a \$2.00 donation will be requested. If a parent has lost his/her number, then a new band will be replaced after the parent has shown his/her approved photo identification to the registration team.

Today the rapidly growing urban areas of the world loom as our greatest mission challenge. In most parts of the world, Adventist churches, institutions, and services tend to be located outside cities instead of where the majority of people live.

CITY **MINISTRY** WAS A PRIORITY FOR ELLEN WHITE.

More than 100 years ago Ellen White told leaders that the church had "neglected" the cities. She recognized that there are certain classes of people "who cannot be reached by public meetings." She championed wholistic urban ministry centers, called Centers of Influence, which would connect the church to the community.

An estimated 10 million Californians experience barriers to dental, vision, and medical care. Life Hope Centers is a program that allows volunteer dentists, optometrists, physicians, health related professionals, and community volunteers to provide a host of health – related services at no charge. Efforts are also made to educate the public about the simple and practical ways individuals can live healthier, happier, and longer.

Centers of Influence follow Jesus' wholistic method of ministry. Ellen White says, "It is through the social relations that Christianity comes in contact with the world." These centers facilitate that vital contact.

USING CHRIST'S METHOD TO REACH THE CITIES





In The Ministry of Healing, Ellen White writes that Christ's method alone will bring true success. She summarizes that method in five steps.

WITH PEOPLE

1. MINGLE : Centers of Influence place us where people live. Literature, public evangelism, radio, TV, and Internet will play a crucial role in the mission of the church. While those are vital ministries, they can never replace personal, hands-on, mingling ministry. Workers in Centers of Influence must be prepared to move out of their comfort zones and form relationships with people who are different from them.

3. MINISTER TO PEOPLE'S **NEEDS**

Types of ministry will vary from place to place. They will include services such as counseling, feeding the hungry, caring for children, teaching life skills, conducting community activities, and teaching language-learning groups. The possibilities are as varied as the needs. Health ministry will almost always connect to people's needs. Jesus spent time ministering to people's needs and physically touching their lives.

Through mingling, showing sympathy, and ministering to : needs, we show people that we care. Of course, we hope and pray that the Holy Spirit will touch their hearts and lead them to a full commitment to Him. But our care and love doesn't depend on them accepting Jesus. When we show people that our care has no strings attached, we build confidence.





This is a vital step in Jesus' method. Leading people to Him is a natural result of wholistic ministry. It arises from the first four steps, where relationships are built. When people start questioning our motivation and why we live the way we do, it is natural to start talking about the Source of our spiritual commitment. Every Center will include intentional plans to start small groups and plant new Seventh-day Adventist congregations.





MOVING HEARTS AND MINDS UPWARD

The CognitiveGenesis Study



PURPOSE

The CognitiveGenesis study, a project undertaken by La Sierra University and the North American Division Office of Education, set out to answer these questions:

1. How well are students doing academically in the Adventist school system?

2. How does academic performance in Adventist schools compare to academic performance in public schools and other private schools?

3. What student, home and school factors are associated with higher academic achievement?

4. What areas could be improved to provide the best possible education?

DESIGN

The study included 51,706 students from Adventist elementary schools and academies in the United States. Academic achievement was assessed by standardized testing using Iowa Tests of Basic Skills4 (elementary grades) and Iowa Tests of Educational Development5 (high school). Student ability was assessed with the Cognitive Abilities Test.

Students, parents, teachers, and administrators were also surveyed to identify factors that might influence scholastic achievement.

In the United States, every conference and almost every Adventist elementary school and academy participated.

FINDINGS

1. Students in all grades, in Adventist schools of all sizes, outperformed the national average in all subjects.

2. Students in Adventist schools had higher-than-expected academic achievement based on an assessment of individual ability.

3. Students who transferred to Adventist schools saw a significant improvement in their test scores. Also, the longer students stayed in the Adventist school system, the more they gained in achievement and ability.





Health Clinics

Inspired by Central's strategic plan and initiative, numerous local churches have participated in health fairs and clinics in an effort to serve their surrounding communities with the hands and feet of Jesus while introducing residents to the Seventh-day Adventist Church, and impacting their area for the Kingdom of Heaven. Over the last three years, 4,279 residents of Central California have received medical, dental and vision attention given by I,900 volunteers. It's clear that the effect of these Life Hope Centers' events on both local churches and local residents continues to be remarkable.

Life Hope Centers

Life Hope Centers' events continue to impact communities throughout Central. With the initial launch last May, the Life Hope Centers' initiative has expanded its reach with a largescale clinic which houses six new dental stations and chairs, eye-care equipment along with other items necessary for the operation of the clinics. The Life Hope Centers' program allows volunteer dentists, optometrists, physicians, health professionals, and community volunteers to provide a host of health-related services at no charge. Efforts are also made to educate communities about the simple and practical ways individuals can live healthier, happier, and longer. In June, a Santa Cruz County event served over 650 residents in and around Soquel by sharing the love of Christ by meeting the needs of the community.



A CLOSER LOOK Life Hope Centers' Health Clinics

Realizing they only had one flier left to give away the day before the clinic, Keri and Loren prayed that God would guide them to just the right person as they headed out on a walk. They saw a young mother and her children, they asked her if they needed any free dental care. "Yes!" the mother responded, "My husband (Jason) has a broken tooth!" They told them to arrive early, and Loren was delighted when he arrived and saw that Jason was 10th in line! By the end of the clinic, Jason had not only had his broken tooth fixed, but also received a free haircut. Before he left the clinic, Jason told Loren, "I'm so happy I learned about the Life Hope Centers' clinic! Thank you!"

LITERATURE MINISTRIES

Literature Ministries

Seventy-five young people in three groups are visiting nearly 300,000 homes as part of Central's Youth Rush this summer (2017). Youth Rush is a summer literature distribution program hosted by churches around the conference. These students will travel a combined 80,000 road miles, meeting people in every corner of our conference's territory, from Lompoc to Sonora and Bakersfield to the Golden Gate. This program allows for God to show His face one door at a time, in His time. Once the literature is distributed, Bible-study requests begin to appear, CROSS trainers step in to facilitate the Bible studies, while mentoring willing, local church members to give their own Bible studies.

CROSS Trainers

With the help of the evangelism offering, CROSS trainers can be found working with I5 of Central's churches, companies, groups, and church plants, facilitating upwards of I50 ongoing Bible studies since last camp meeting. CROSS training (formerly known as Bible work) is an acronym: Churches Reaching Out to Serve and Save. **A CLOSER LOOK** Youth Rush

In Bakersfield, Josh smiled politely at Wiljon as he opened his door but explained that he was an atheist and was not interested in any of the books. losh explained how he had become disillusioned with his unanswered questions. Wiljon asked for an example and proceeded to host a small Bible study on the front steps. Josh was amazed as Wiljon answered his questions and exclaimed, "You must be a Seventh-day Adventist! I've listened to your local radio station before!" He eagerly signed up for personal Bible studies and plans to attend an upcoming Revelation Seminar.





A CLOSER LOOK CROSS Trainers

One such CROSS Trainer knocked on the door of Erica. Erica was soon baptized, her son was baptized, her brother was baptized, her neighbor was baptized, and her parents have also been baptized. Her sister and her sister's family are taking Bible studies. And her husband, who is still a member of another faith, is attending church on a regular basis with her. When not giving Bible studies, CROSS trainers are leading members through specialized classes on how to give studies, and become spiritual friends.

GLOW

As the GLOW (Giving Light to Our World) ministry approaches IO years since its launch in Central, over 81 million have been printed for every corner of the earth in over 60 languages. Central continues to inspire and empower members to share their faith through distribution of these short, topical tracts. Seeing the activity of churches and schools right here in Central, conferences around the country and divisions around the world continue to realize GLOW's impact. Schools hold GLOW Bible Labs for students, and churches conduct GLOWa-thons to inspire their communities. With I.6 million tracts going out monthly, GLOW continually receives a lot of exciting stories from GLOWers.

A CLOSER LOOK GLOW


An elderly man received a GLOW tract on the state of the dead. He called in and said, "This pamphlet explained step-by-step the process of life and death to immortality, something of my 83 years of life of being a Christian I never understood until now. I feel like I am now a complete Christian. How can I get this pamphlet to share with people around me? Most everyone I know has died, but there are people around in the community I could share with until I die."



PUBLIC EVANGELISM

Local Church Evangelism

Expanding the scope of Vacation Bible Xperience (VBX) has proven fruitful among many Central churches that have hosted a program this year. VBX is a tremendous opportunity for the local church to interact with its community. Although only I2 churches reported on their Summer 2016 VBX programs, the events drew 587 children, aged 4–15 years, from within the church family, and an additional 223 children from the neighborhoods around the church buildings. Additionally, 216 teens volunteered while pointing VBX kids to the love of Jesus. Nearly every church has follow-up plans to continue reaching children for Christ.



A CLOSER LOOK VBX

Central churches have reached across their cities to partner with other Adventist churches to plan together, share resources, and stagger their programs. By doing this, they increase the exposure in their neighborhoods and add value to their communities. As an incentive for churches to hold VBX programs, the Children's Ministry Department offered free Cactusville kits to churches that attended workshops and team training. Thus far, 25 churches are planning the summer outreach.

A CLOSER LOOK Local Church Evangelism Meetings

Bakersfield Central's series took place in February. It had a great community turnout, thanks in part to the radio advertising leading up to it. But, personal invitations from a business owner brought others. One, with another religious background, had been visiting the church and came forward for baptism. Another was a 70 year-old man who had left the church, recommitted himself and was baptized.

Local Church Evangelistic Meetings

Fifty-seven public evangelism meetings were funded by the evangelism offering in 2016 which contributed to over 855 baptisms. In the first quarter of 2017, we were blessed with an additional 146 baptisms. Meetings were held by conference Evangelist Anil Kanda, along with associate evangelists Antonio Cano, Ivor Myers, and Nathan Renner, in addition to other guest evangelists such as Robert Clouzet and Eddy R. Perez.

Seminary of Adventist Laity (SAL) is a lay evangelism program hosted at the San Jose Spanish Church. The goal of the program is to educate, equip, and train church members to engage in evangelism through this three-year program. Students take five classes each year from Andrews University Professors.



A CLOSER LOOK SAL

The program requires students to implement what they've learned each year. The first year focused on Small Groups, and each student was required to lead in a small group. The second year focused on Preaching, and each student was required to hold an evangelistic effort. This year, the emphasis has been on Health, and many health fairs have been held and organized by each student in their local community.



A CLOSER LOOK The Ark

Member involvement is always important in a growing church. In its infancy, The Ark sparked interest in a self-proclaimed back-bencher. She finally got tired of her non-role and volunteered to help plant a new church. Today, she proclaims that doing this was the best decision in her life, and has been blessed by her involvement in doing something for Christ.



Strategic Church Planting

Another critical outreach ministry funded by the evangelism offering is the planting of new church congregations. Central is blessed with six thriving church plants. The Ark in Visalia was initiated several years ago when, the then pastor, Chad Stuart asked for volunteers to start a new church. Members embraced the opportunity and the group has grown to 65–70 members with the help of an evangelism offering-funded CROSS Trainer.

SPIRITUAL RETREATS

Women's Retreats

In 2017, over 600 women gathered for the 20th-annual Women's Retreat, about 100 of whom were members of another faith. This year, while Celebrating God's Grace, participants experienced life-changing moments and emerging stories of God's divine intervention in the lives of those present. Some visiting attendees benefited from a scholarship funded by the evangelism offering.

Teen Girls' Retreat

Themed Lost and Found: Lessons from Ruth, the retreat for teen girls I3–I7 years-old, was held in April at Fresno Adventist Academy. The teens who attended, came from different backgrounds, including a variety of other Christian faiths. They learned that God leads through adversity and that He is constantly providing opportunities for growth. God loves His daughters! The staff, who took part in the retreat are looking forward to an even bigger teen girls' retreat next year.

A CLOSER LOOK Education

EDUCATION

Adventist education offers a tremendous opportunity for students to grow academically, spiritual and socially. In order to acquaint new Seventh-day Adventist members with the value of Adventist education, the camp meeting evangelism offering funds two-year scholarships to newly baptized members. Twenty-one newly-baptized-member scholarships were distributed to students attending an Adventist school in Central. In addition, Central's evangelism offering also funds four public high-school campus ministries.



YOUTH MINISTRIES

Camp Wawona Scholarships

For some families, sending their children to summer camp seems impossible. When one Central pastor identified a need, he saw an opportunity to make summer camp a reality for eight children in his church district, two of which have been baptized. Every year, summercamp scholarships are funded by the evangelism offering for campers who are not members of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Last year, 36 full and partial scholarships were awarded. This year, I6 applications have been submitted, with more to come.

Public High School Outreach

Members of several Fresno area churches had a dream to make an impact in young lives. The end result—a thriving Christian club on a public high school campus. The L.I.F.E. (Living in Full Engagement) Club started small but now meets in the largest room available. The Thursday lunch-club meeting feeds, physically and spiritually, 70 plus teenagers. But that's not all! Teen Bible Academy (TBA)

TBA is a three-week discipleship and evangelistic training program for teens based on the elements of solitude, study, and service. This summer, 40 students will spend time in three different cities across the conference, learning how to have a personal relationship with Jesus, how to study the Bible for themselves, and how to share Jesus within their own communities. Teens are not the only ones that benefit from the program. Intentional mentoring of TBA staff members equip them to go on to become leaders in their local churches.

A CLOSER LOOK Public School Outreach

Lives change because of the L.I.F.E. club. At the close of school last year, eleven students went on a retreat with the club. Of those eleven, five have been baptized. Eleven others attended the Youth Praver Conference, four attended the Lost and Found: Lessons from Ruth Girls' Retreat, plus, some have applied for Youth Rush, or to attend Teen Bible Academy - all programs supported by the camp meeting evangelism offering.



PRAYER MINISTRIES

Prayer Ministries Training

Where do you go when you want to reconnect with God? You go to a prayer leadership training event. Pastor Pavel Goia presented his Vital Prayer series during Central's Prayer Leadership Training. He shared how we can have a vital connection with God and how our prayers need to be focused on getting to know Him. Goia revealed that many focus on receiving blessings, when the focus should be on knowing the One who provides those blessings. The rewards will come as a result. When we focus on God, our problems and issues will also be placed in perspective. During a time of personal sharing, many reflected they had been deeply convicted of their need to focus their time and attention on getting to know God — praying that God would provide the desire to know Him. Others shared their excitement to return home in order to share their experience with others. What difference would it make if we all got to know Him better?

A CLOSER LOOK Prayer Conference

Heading up the children's programming was Holly Cline, who runs the Kindergarten Tent at Soquel Camp Meeting. She anticipated a handful of children throughout the weekend. To her surprise, 75 children attended. All of the activities related to and encouraged prayer. Prayer Conference


